County Enacts New Ordinances

Adult Oriented Business Ordinance No. 284, Series 2012

Our previous ordinance restricting activity in adult-oriented businesses has been in place since 1999. Since that time the Kentucky Supreme Court has provided additional legal guidance in the area of community regulation. Because of the increased availability of alcohol in our community, Fiscal Court decided to revise Ordinance No. 143, Series 1999. Currently no adult-oriented business exists in unincorporated Hardin County; however, a proactive approach to updating our ordinance is justified.

Alcoholic Beverage Control Ordinance No. 285, Series 2012

In a special precinct election on April 17, 2012, the voters of Country Club Precinct, voted to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages by the drink. Subsequently, Fiscal Court approved the "Alcoholic Beverage Control Ordinance No. 285, Series 2012" to regulate the sale and distribution of distilled spirits, wine, and malt-based beverages in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community.

Deceased Farm Animal Assistance Program

Our County, concerned with the preservation of a safe water supply for our citizens and to assist our farming community, applied in December to the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board for Rural Development Funds to assist with the cost of the removal of dead livestock. Through this program, fallen livestock will be removed from the property and disposed of in an environmentally sound method at no cost to the owner. This is the 10th consecutive year we are offering this popular program to Hardin County Farmers.
