Hardin County Fiscal Court moves into the 21st Century

The Fiscal Court renovation project was completed in January to accommodate five additional members to our Fiscal Court by adding desks in the third floor courtroom.

We added monitors as well as internet access to every desk in the courtroom. We also mounted four large wall monitors to the front and back of the courtroom to enhance the quality of our court presentations for viewing by the public.

To reduce costs, we introduced an electronic agenda process to the members of the new Fiscal Court enabling them to view court documents online from their homes or in the courtroom using laptop computers. The electronic process eliminates the need to copy and mail documents to eight magistrates twice a month.

We replaced our “vintage” TV cameras and other video/audio equipment in the courtroom with state-of-the-art equipment to improve the quality of our Fiscal Court recording to our home viewers.

Some cosmetic changes include new carpeting and a raised platform for the magistrates’ desks to improve their visibility and to cover the necessary wiring for the technology.

The state emblem which hung in the courtroom when it was used by Circuit Court was replaced with the Hardin County emblem.
