

HARDIN COUNTY FISCAL COURT

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-048

Be it Resolved, upon the recommendation of Hardin County Judge/Executive Harry L. Berry and with the concurrence of the Public Works Committee to approve the following regulations concerning encroachment permits and fees:

ENCROACHMENT PERMITS:

1. All encroachments on county right-a-way will have a permit and be inspected.
2. Installation of a driveway culvert by Hardin County Road Department on new driveway construction includes one load of gravel and labor (on county maintained roads only). Property owner will provide the approved culvert pipe and additional gravel.
3. All driveways, county and property owner installed tiles will be inspected before asphalt or concrete are in place. Developers, contractors, and property owners must notify County Road Supervisor prior to road or driveway surfacing.
4. The encroachment permit will include two inspections, if the owner installs the culvert pipe.
5. Property owners and developers will be responsible for drainage ditches in front of their property for two years after the subdivision is accepted by Hardin County Fiscal Court.

FEES:

1. Encroachment permit only	\$ 60.00
County installation	<u>\$ 200.00</u>
Total	\$ 260.00

Notes:

- a. Encroachment permits are for 24' of pipe in length. For additional length over 24', an additional fee of \$15.00 per every 6' will be required.
 - b. County installation is for 24' of pipe in length. County will install additional length over 24', for an additional fee of \$50.00 per every 6'.
2. Encroachment permit for farm entrance with proposed farm use (farm entrance only)

Encroachment Permit Only	\$ 60.00
County Installation	<u>\$ 200.00</u>
Total	\$ 260.00
 3. Encroachment permits for existing entrance with proposed change of use (farm entrance to residential entrance, residential entrance to commercial entrance, etc.)
Fee: \$60.00

4. Encroachment permits for existing entrance without change of use (if the use of the property does not change--replacing one manufactured home with another, etc.)
Fee: \$30.00

Failure to follow the above regulations may result in the County Road Supervisor's refusal to recommend the subdivision street or driveway culvert be accepted into the County Road Maintenance System.
