## Bluegrass Pipeline Community Grant Program



The Bluegrass Pipeline team is committed to being a good neighbor by putting safety, environmental stewardship and community support at the heart of its operations. To help achieve this objective, the Bluegrass Pipeline has established a fund to benefit local communities within the counties traversed by the pipeline project. The mission of the Bluegrass Pipeline Community Grant Program is to identify and help fund projects that directly benefit the surrounding communities.

### GRANTS UP TO \$25,000 PER ORGANIZATION:

Grants up to \$25,000 per year will be awarded based on community need. Projects funded by the Bluegrass Pipeline Community Grant Program should provide community benefits, with specific emphasis for projects impacting:

- First Responders / Emergency & Safety Preparedness
- Youth or Senior Services
- Education Programs
- Economic Development
- Enhancement of open spaces and park land for recreation
- Enrichment of wildlife habitat
- Promotion of environmental education
- Preservation of wetlands and wildlife habitat

### COMMUNITY GRANT GUIDELINES

- Applications are only accepted online.
- Applications must be for projects within counties that host the Bluegrass Pipeline.
- Project must start within 12 months of receiving funding.
- Grant recipients will be selected by a review committee based on community benefits.
- Projects with a matching element will be given priority.
- Projects must have a proven capability of completion/success.
- Grants cannot fund wages, administrative costs or planning costs.
- Grants will not be awarded to religious or political groups.

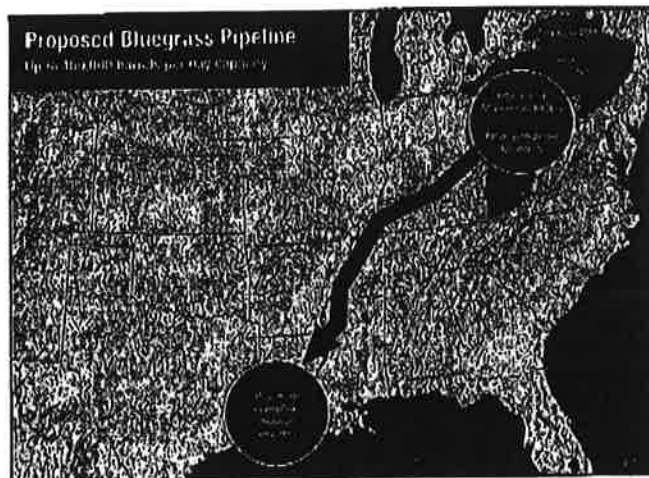
### SUBMITTING PROPOSALS

- Grants submitted by **August 31** will be considered for awards by **October 15**.
