


**HARDIN COUNTY FISCAL COURT



To whom it may concern:

My name is Becky Miller and I would like to be considered for the Extension District Board opening as a 4-H representative. I live at 40 Brangers Lane, Elizabethtown Kentucky 42701. While my address is an Elizabethtown address it is really closer to Rineyville than Elizabethtown. Three years ago I retired from the United States Postal Service. I was the Postmaster of the Rineyville Post office for over fifteen years when I retired. Serving my community as Postmaster was not a job, it was a pleasure.

Service is something that I learned early in my life as a member in my 4-H community of Masaryktown, Florida where I started my 4-H experience. I continued to use my experiences in 4-H throughout my life as I grew into a responsible youth, adult, employee, wife and mother.

In 1996 I started working with the fifth graders of Rineyville School as their 4-H leader. The first year we had the school club they only let us have the fifth graders as they wanted to see how well the 4-H program could fit into the school schedule and how the students would benefit from the program. The following year I held club meetings with both the fourth and fifth grade students. As the school numbers grew it became impossible for one person to be able to have all the classroom 4-H meetings. At that time Bonnie Jolly started helping to conduct the 4-H meetings at Rineyville Elementary School. I continued to be involved with the school clubs until I could no longer take a day off (using annual leave) from my job. I did not mind using my leave but there was a demand for my time at work.

At the time I left the school 4-H clubs, I became the leader for the Hoof, Paws, and Claws Club. Later we change the name to the Paws Club. I worked with this club until 2013. While club leader, I took the members to 4-H Dog Camp every year. The dog camp is a fun learning experience for both the dogs, and the club members. As the dog club leader I had the members become involved with the SpringHaven Domestic Shelter. The club members enjoyed working on projects to raise money for the shelter, as well as learn how to serve people in our community.

I attended 4-H camp as an adult councilor for eight summers. It was truly a family affair as my husband attended as the boy's adult councilor, and our daughter attended as a teen councilor. Our son attended as a camper each year.

I have been a continuous 4-H council member since 1996, filling the roles of president, vice president and secretary at different times.

While my children have aged out of 4-H, I continue to serve on the 4-H Council and help with our many fundraising projects. In just a few short years I will again become involved with the various clubs, as my granddaughter will be joining 4-H when they reach the age.
