

HARDIN COUNTY FISCAL COURT

REGULAR MEETING
SEPTEMBER 23, 2014

Hardin County Judge/Executive Harry L. Berry called the Hardin County Fiscal Court Meeting to order and requested a roll call vote. Voting: Williams yes, Clem yes, Thompson yes, Morgan yes, King yes, Judge Berry yes, Wiseman yes, Easter yes, Goodman yes.

The invocation was given by Squire Goodman.

Squire Morgan led the court in the pledge of allegiance.

Judge Berry requested that County Attorney, Jenny Oldham, conduct the Public Hearing on the relocation of abandoned graves at 1058 North Mulberry Street, Elizabethtown.

Ken Howard spoke on behalf of the Hartlage and Howard family, they have entered into an agreement to acquire property at 1058 North Mulberry Street, Elizabethtown from Martha Drake. He addressed the court on the relocation of the graves that are in the Edlin Cemetery which would be at the expense of the owner Martha Drake (but the cost would be added into the amount the Hartlage and Howard's would pay Ms. Drake). Bob Brown, funeral director of Brown's Funeral Home, would be in charge of moving the graves.

Gary Kempf spoke on behalf of Ancestral Trails, saying there are 20 unmarked and 13 marked burials. He spoke of possible artifacts findings. He would rather gravesites stay at present location but if not he recommends all graves stay together.

Diane Swank Pilla, a direct descendant of John Swank, says he is her 4th great grandfather, says she thinks he fought in the American Revolution. She is assuming John Swank's wife, Rosanna, is buried also at the gravesite. She wants their gravesites to stay where they are now.

John Pilla, husband of Diane Swank Pilla, said he heard that other states require you to get permission from all family members before you can move the graves.

John Lay, Ancestral Trails member, spoke on the history of John Swank and his wife, Rosanna. He said the site location was a pioneer fort that John Swank built to protect themselves.

Joey Fible, direct descendent of John Swank, says he is his 5th great grandfather, and wants all the graves to stay together and moved to another location. He suggested Ridge Springs in Rineyville Cemetery.

Darla Fible would like all the gravesites to stay where they are now.

Marlane Youngblood, President of the Hardin County Public Library Board, and Renee Hutcherson, Director of Hardin County Public Library Board, presented the Hardin County Public Library Annual Report.

King moved and Clem seconded to approve Resolution No. 2014-138 to approve EMS job description. Voting: Morgan yes, King yes, Judge Berry yes, Wiseman yes, Easter yes, Goodman yes, Williams yes, Clem yes, Thompson yes.

Morgan moved and King seconded to approve Resolution No. 2014-140 appointing Caleb T. Bland to the Hardin County Board of Ethics to fill the unexpired term of Matt Hess. Voting: King yes, Judge Berry yes, Wiseman yes, Easter yes, Goodman yes, Williams yes, Clem yes, Thompson yes, Morgan yes.

Goodman moved and Williams seconded to approve the Consent Agenda to include approving Claims Batch Nos. 03-7002 and 03-7023, approve Resolution No. 2014-139 regarding financial transfers, approve Resolution No. 2014-134 regarding EMS personnel (Erin Yates, Daniel Killian, Terry Guggisberg), approve Resolution No. 2014-137 revising job descriptions for Road, EMS, and E-911 personnel, approve Detention Center's August 2014 report, approve Treasurer's August report, approve Solid Waste Committee 09/15/14 minutes, approve Resources and Community Support Committee 09/16/14 minutes, approve Emergency Services Committee 09/18/14 minutes, and approve Fiscal Court 09/09/14 minutes. Voting: Judge Berry yes, Wiseman yes, Easter yes, Goodman yes, Williams yes, Clem yes, Thompson yes, Morgan yes, King yes.

Squire Williams announced next Tuesday, September 30th, that 100 Ideals on New Businesses will be at the Brown Pusey House at 6:00 p.m.


