Saturday, **April 19** at our County Landfill, and on the following Saturday, **April 26**, we are joining with several local corporate sponsors to offer E-Scrap Recycling Day at AGC Automotive Americas' Plant.

Landfill Free Service Day

The county landfill accepts all materials not regulated or defined as hazardous. All loads must be secured and covered. We cannot accept tires, batteries, anti-freeze, motor oil, paint or any other free-flowing liquids. Refrigerators and air conditioners must have freon removed and a proper stamp applied. All vehicles will be weighed in and out on this day.

We will offer two additional free-service days on July 12 and September 20.

Directions: From Interstate 65, (North or South) take Exit 93 to the Bluegrass Parkway, travel East on the Bluegrass Parkway approximately 8 miles to Exit 8. Turn right and immediately turn right again on Audubon Trace Road.

What is E-Scrap?

Electronic scrap or waste is a term used for unwanted or end-of-life computers and technology equipment. It includes most equipment with a power cord such as computers, printers, keyboards, mice, servers, televisions.

Electronics may contain chlorinated solvents, brominated flame retardants, heavy metals, beryllium, lithium, and PVC plastics. When broken, these toxic materials can seep out, contaminate the local environment, and affect the health and safety of people nearby. The United States generated approximately 2.37 million tons of E-Waste in 2009—but only 25% was recycled. The remainder went into municipal landfills. E-Scrap or waste accounts for 40% of the heavy metals in landfills.

Our E-Scrap recycler will remove the hard drives from computers to destroy your personal data. They will overwrite the data or physically destroy the hard drive to protect your privacy.
