


## **About National Police Week**

In 1962, President John F. Kennedy signed a proclamation designating May 15 as Peace Officers Memorial Day and the week in which that date falls as Police Week. **Peace Officers Memorial** Day honors federal, state, and local officers killed or disabled in the line of duty. It is observed in conjunction with Police Week (May 13—19, 2018).

Currently, 25,000 to 40,000 visitors from around the world converge on Washington, DC to participate in planned events honoring those who have died in the line of service. The Memorial Service began in 1982 as a gathering in Senate Park of approximately 120 survivors and supporters of law enforcement.
