SECTION A: PROJECT DESCRIPTION

1. This is an expansion of a project (HHW) that we have participated in several previous years. We would like to include our annual E-Scrap event also. We collect all E-Scrap during a spring event and all Household Hazardous Waste during our Fall Event. Both of these events for the previous year were a huge success. We almost doubled the volume on both events as compared to the past. We will contract the services of a qualified environmental firm to collect and properly dispose of all this material. Participation in the both events continues to increase from year to year as more become aware of these annual events. As participation increases, so does the cost to sponsor these events.
2. We will have (2) drop-off sites located in the Industrial Park in the City of Elizabethtown (1 for HHW and 1 for E-scrap). These are central locations and have worked well in the past. This site will serve Elizabethtown, Radcliff, West Point, Vine Grove, Upton, Sonora and other smaller unincorporated areas of the county.

These both will be a one day event each and we anticipate a large response.

- Both sites we will have volunteers to assist in unloading of the vehicles. There will be a qualified environmental firm on site, properly staffed, to handle any materials delivered to us. Both companies are contracted to accept and properly process all the materials at their off-site addresses. The hours will be from 8:00 AM until 2:00 PM, and extended if necessary.

SECTION B: PROJECT ADVERTISING AND EDUCATION

- We will promote via a local radio station, social media outlets and the local newspaper. We will have printed brochures for distribution in local industries, schools and government buildings. Prior to the event (1-2 weeks), we will place a large banner at the collection point and the Recycling Drop-off point at Farmer's Market giving the date, time and a brief list of items accepted. Also prior to the event (4-5 weeks) we will have a large lighted road sign placed for several days in the areas mentioned above for several days each displaying this information 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. All information will be listed on our web site as well several weeks prior.
- The local government along with businesses located in the Industrial Park will do most of the promotions. We have some local civic organizations that like to volunteer as well as citizens and employees throughout the county.

- Bulbs must be in contained boxes with ends taped.

Logistics:

- Cobalt will provide company 53' van trailer onsite during the entire event. We will use this for the television collection and live load as we receive the material.
- Four other 53' van trailers are scheduled to arrive during the event. This will allow us to live load each trailer as material is collected.
- Cobalt will supply all necessary packaging materials including pallets, Gaylord boxes, shrink wrap, and a pallet jack for the event.

Wootley said he "didn't know" he was going to be in the industry. Wootley started his musical career in the FAME Studios in Muscle Shoals, Alabama, under the guidance of producer and future Rock Hall inductor Rick Hall, who was the manager for a soul trio called The O'Jays. A Wootley gained recognition, he found he was in Nashville, Tennessee. There, he scored a recording deal in 1971 on the basis of some demo recordings that showcased his authentic soulful and his understanding of the hard-working country audience, the website said.

"I'm a traditionalist," he says in his album information segment on his website. "I came to Nashville because of pioneers and heroes like Merle Haggard and George Jones. I've seen people hear this until they're blind in the vision to see it's very true."

On June 20 in Elizabethton, Wootley's opening acts include Rick Huckaby (Huck) and Ryan Davis.

Davis is a bluegrass country artist from Big, Kentucky. Both is a headliner and supporting act. Davis performs two live shows a year.

Huckaby is a Nashville, Tennessee, singer, songwriter and guitar player, combining influences such as Robbie Gray, Bonnie Raitt, Merle Haggard, Ronnie Milsap and Keith Whitley.

"This is going to be a night to remember as the first concert of this calendar in downtown," Co-Events Program Manager Sarah Vaughn said in the release. "We have limited tickets so buy them quickly, it's going to be a great night."
