

## Hardin County Fiscal Court

### Resolution No. 2023-105

**WHEREAS**, KRS 64.045 (4) requires the fiscal court to initiate reapportionment proceedings in May of the first year following the decennial census of the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, the most recent United States decennial census was conducted in 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, KRS 67.045 (5) requires the appointment of a reapportionment commission comprised of three (3) competent citizens of the county, over twenty-one years of age, and residing in different districts of the county as voting members for the purpose of reapportioning the county into not less than three (3) nor more than eight (8) Justice of the Peace (magistrate) districts; and

**WHEREAS**, KRS 67.045 (5) allows for the appointment of nonvoting members to assist with the reapportionment process; and

**WHEREAS**, KRS 67.045 (5) provides the fiscal court may fix a reasonable compensation of the voting members of the reapportionment commission; and

**WHEREAS**, KRS 67.045 (6) requires the reapportionment commission, within sixty (60) days of their appointment, to lay off the boundary lines of the districts and to file with the county clerk and each member of fiscal court a written report showing the boundary of each district and the estimated population in each; now therefore

#### **BE IT RESOLVED:**

1. The following three (3) citizens of Hardin County are appointed effective May 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2023 as the voting members of the reapportionment commission to reapportion Hardin County into not less than three (3) nor more than eight (8) Justice of the Peace (magistrate) districts:

Trina Martin – 7<sup>th</sup> District  
Jacob Pearman – 8<sup>th</sup> District  
Howard Williams – 1<sup>st</sup> District

2. The following two (2) citizens of Hardin County are appointed as nonvoting members of the reapportionment commission to provide the necessary technical, legal, and administrative support to the commission:

Brian D. Smith – Hardin County Clerk  
Jennifer B. Oldham – Hardin County Attorney

3. Compensation for the voting members of the reapportionment commission is fixed at \$300 each for the duration of their service on the commission.
4. The reapportionment commission shall file their written report with the Hardin County Fiscal Court no later than 25 July 2023.
